

CHAPTER ELEVEN – A MOST IMPORTANT CHAPTER IN THE BIBLE – PART THREE

Today we conclude our study of Revelation 11, one of the most _____ chapters in the entire Bible. As we finish today's text God reminds us that we are once again concluding another trip through the tribulation period. We know this is true because of the subject matter found in verses 15-19, and in particular the statement – "The kingdoms of this world have become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of his Christ; and he shall reign for ever and ever."

As if things during the tribulation have not been bad enough, the sounding of this _____ trumpet judgment (verse 15) ushers in the most horrific scene the lost unrepentant world will witness: The second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ (as the Lion of the tribe of Juda – Rev. 5:5). For the lost this will be a fearful sight...for those who know Him it will be the rejoicing of their heart.
