## THREE BASIC APPLICATIONS

1. Historical: Jeremiah preaches to all the people of Israel (Judah) and promises her fate if they do not \_\_\_\_\_. He prophesies their impending destruction and ultimate restoration. His judgments include Judah, Jerusalem, and the Gentile nations.
2. Devotional: All born again believers, as God's ambassadors, should preach the message of repentance to the lost and \_\_\_\_\_...to admonish all to have complete heartfelt faith in the word of God, to love God, and obey the gospel.

## THREE BASIC APPLICATIONS
