## THREE BASIC APPLICATIONS

1. Historical: The real-life, non-fictional story of Job (Ezk. 14:14, 20; James 5:11), the greatest of all the men of the East, his \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_.
2. Devotional: Contains endless applications – to teach us how to realistically and biblically deal with the \_\_\_\_\_ of life; fundamental principles of biblical counseling and how NOT to do it (I.E. 5:17); to teach us about \_\_\_\_\_ spiritual warfare and how it effects us in the physical world...our life is greatly affected by powers beyond our sight and control!
3. Doctrinal: Several prophetic applications – The Jew during the tribulation period (troubles on earth); Christ's suffering (separated from God, suffering as our substitute); A lost man living through troubles on earth without God...his trials drive him straight onto the ash heap, but in the end he recognizes his sinfulness and \_\_\_\_\_ – 2 Co. 7:10.

### OUTLINE STRUCTURE

#### Basic Outline

##### Chapters:

- 1-3: The \_\_\_\_\_'s attack against Job (in actuality it is an attack on God's character).
- 4-37: Pride, resistance, accusations, self-centeredness, troubles, trials and tribulations of Job and his \_\_\_\_\_.
- 38-42: Job's \_\_\_\_\_ and humbling; the restoration of Job, and the healing of his relationship with God and with men.

#### ADDITIONAL NOTES

1. The book of Job records the \_\_\_\_\_ time Satan speaks in the Bible (*He speaks directly three times; Genesis 3, Job 1-2, In the gospels while tempting Christ*). The book of Job, because of its very nature and theme, also contains the revelation of the Leviathan (*chapter 41*) and the Behemoth (*chapter 40*). There are no more instructive passages in the whole Bible outlining the identity, strength, and tactics of Satan than here in Job!
5. Devotional lessons learned from Job:
  - Some questions will \_\_\_\_\_ be answered in life. God owes us \_\_\_\_\_ explanation.
  - Some believers suffer for no reason of their own making.
  - We are but a small part of a huge spiritual war that has been raging since the fall of Lucifer.
  - When overwhelmed by trials, we should see the big picture, "The Kingdom." We should stand in awe and let God be God.
  - All trials for righteousness sake, ultimately lead to \_\_\_\_\_ beginnings!
