 - Hides hatred with lying lips and utters slander, 10:18
 - Mocks sin, 14:9
 - Cannot be reproved, 17:10
 - Cannot see wisdom when it is right in his face, “*but*” is always looking for it (“*he says*”), 17:24
 - Meddles in others business, 20:3
 - Returns to trouble like a dog to his own vomit, 26:11
