	-	A man, woman, boy or girl is saved by through faith in Christ and is permanently kept in that state by God. Every saved sinner is now "in Christ" and justified by Jesus' finished atonement, completely apart from the works of the law. Not even circumcision, which preceded the law, has any part in justification. Therefore, all "gospels" which exhort the sinner to any kind of human works in order to obtain justification from God are gospels proceeding from the mouths of cursed lost men.
